Acetaminophen or ibuprofen may be safer for pain relief. Some expert opinion indicates that low-dose (75 to 325 mg daily) aspirin may be used as a blood thinning agent for use in breastfeeding women who require it. Avoid high-dose, long-term use of aspirin, if possible. bupivacaine.

Most drugs are not licensed for administration via enteral feeding tubes. Interaction can occur between drugs and the enteral feed. Clinically significant interactions include, phenytoin, digoxin, ciprofloxacin and rifampicin. A pharmacist should therefore be involved in any decision to administer drugs via this route.
