**ARTIFICIAL INCUBATION OR NATURAL INCUBATION**

First, there is natural incubation. If you don't want to use natural incubation, you can use an artificial incubator. The artificial incubator tries to recreate the conditions that the hen creates. Because the hen's incubation is natural, is it very hard to replicate those temperatures and conditions.

*Natural vs. Artificial Incubation - A2 Steam Chickens*

Artificial incubators can only imitate nature. The hatch rate is considerably lower for artificial incubators than for natural incubation. Artificial incubators can often only hatch 60-80% of the eggs, while duck moms can usually hatch 90-100%. And I think it is a wonderful advantage for the ducks to actually have a MOTHER.

It is slightly more complicated and time consuming to incubate an egg yourself using an incubator, for example you will have to check the egg regularly.
